EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 88-01

TO FIGHT DRUG USE ON GUAM.

WHEREAS, illegal use of drugs may result in loss of lives and is hazardous to the health of the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, crime experts have determined that Guam's high crime rate is directly related to illegal use of drugs; and

WHEREAS, illegal use of drugs robs the young people of Guam their dignity, their secure future, and their educational and employment opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALICE OFTANA, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do hereby order that:

1. The Department of Education and Guam Community College increase supervision of students on campus to discourage illegal drug use.
2. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Department of Education and Guam Community College create an alcohol and drug abuse rehabilitation program for all students.
3. The Guam Police Department, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Department of Education and Guam Community College improve their existing drug education programs by reaching those students who most need exposure to the programs.
4. The Guam Police Department increase the number of narcotics officers and traffic patrol units to enforce laws against illegal drug use and driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol.
5. The Attorney General prepare legislation making possession and sale of illegal drugs subject to harsher punishment.
