EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 88-27

RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A HEPATITIS B IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM FOR INFANTS AND CHILDREN

- WHEREAS, Hepatitis B is a serious disease which affects the liver, and is caused by the Hepatitis B virus; and
- WHEREAS, Hepatitis B virus infection is present in islands of the Pacific; and
- WHEREAS, Hepatitis B infection frequently leads to the development of a chronic carrier state which has severe medical, personal and economic consequences; and
- WHEREAS, those who are infected at a very young age are prone to develop very serious liver disease, such as cirrhosis and liver cancer; and
- WHEREAS, vaccination of infants and children is an effective strategy to prevent Hepatitis B virus infection; and
- WHEREAS, a large donation of Hepatitis B (HB) vaccine has been donated by Merck, Sharpe and Dohme, for use in the Pacific Islands during the next twelve months; and
- WHEREAS, the Pacific Island Health Officers Association, representing the Pacific island jurisdictions of the Republic of Belau, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, the Republic of the Marshalls, American Samoa, and the Territory of Guam, are participating in the Hepatitis B Vaccination Program for infants and children; and
- WHEREAS, the Hepatitis B Vaccination Program is a collaborative effort of U.S. Public Health Service Region IX and Centers for Disease Control, U.S. Health and Human Services, of Department and Interior, the State of Department of Hawaii Health and the Pacific Department of island jurisdictions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of the Territory of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do hereby order that:

1. The Department of Public Health and Social Services spearhead the Hepatitis B Vaccination Program for newborns and children on Guam. EXECUTIVE ORDER HEPATITIS B VACCINATION PROGRAM PAGE 2



- All appropriate agencies such as the Department of Education, and Guam Memorial Hospital, render to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, all 2. necessary support and resources necessary to carry out the objectives of the project.
- The Department of Public Health and Social Services 3. shall seek support and assistance from the civilian and military medical communities for successful implementation of the Project and the protection of our children's health.
- The Department of Public Health and Social Services seek means of continuing the program on an ongoing 4. basis.
