Executive Order No.90-05

Providing Overtime to Law Enforcement Officers and Rescinding Executive Orders 86-07 and 76-23.

- WHEREAS, Executive Order 86-07 changed the method by which certain uniformed personnel of the government of Guam received payment for hours worked in excess of forty hours per week; and
- WHEREAS, law enforcement personnel, who dally face danger in carrying out their duties, should be paid overtime in the same manner that other government of Guam employees are paid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of the Territory of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act, do hereby order that effective with the pay period commencing February II, 1990:

- I. All law enforcement personnel shall be paid compensation, for hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours per week at a rate of one and one—half times the regular rate at which he or she is employed;
- 2. Payment of the overtime compensation shall be made in accordance with the Personnel Rules governing employees of the Executive Branch;
- 3. Compensatory hours accrued pursuant to Executive Order 86-07 shall be discharged in the manner prescribed in Executive Order 86-07 or appropriate payment shall be made to the employee; and
- 4. Executive Orders 86-07 and 76-23 are rescinded.
