EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 91-37

AMEMDMENT TO EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 91-16

RELATIVE TO THE IMPORTATION OF SAND AND OTHER QUARRIED PRODUCTS

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 91-16 promulgated rules and regulations on the importation of sand and other quarried products; and

WHEREAS, difficulties have been encountered with certain sections in the rules and regulations and the Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to amend Executive Order 91-16 to rectify the problems;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam and pursuant to the authorities vested in the Department of Agriculture, do hereby order as follows:

1. Section 2 of Executive Order 91-16 is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Permit Required. No person shall import any sand, other quarried and mined products (hereinafter sand) without first obtaining an importation permit from the Department. Failure to obtain a permit will result in the sand shipment being rejected and refused entry into Guam and subjecting the importing person to punishment as prescribed under 5 GCA §61110. Permit shall be obtained prior to the loading of regulated sand, quarried and mined products on a vessel so as to insure compliance with required certificates and documents.

2. Section 3 of Executive Order 91-16 is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. <u>Certificates required</u>. Any person importing sand into the Territory of Guam shall provide the following certificates:

- a) Chemical composition;
- b) Pest free certification;



- c) Treatment Certificate; and
- d) Certificate of Origin.

Only certificates issued by the appropriate government agencies (certificate of origin by the Ministry of Trade and/or Exports; Pest free certification by the Ministry of Agriculture or Health, etc.) or competent, recognized laboratories shall be acceptable. All certificates shall be issued in the official language of Guam which is English or Chamorro.

3. The interim rules and regulations shall remain in effect until such time that the Guam Legislature approves the final regulations.
