EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 95-13

RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A WELFARE REFORM TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, due to the continuing increase of welfare population and case load and present budget constraints, the Department of Public Health and Social Services has requested that a Welfare Reform Task Force be set up to address the current situation; and

WHEREAS, the Welfare Reform proposal now pending in the U.S. House of Representatives will change the funding available to Guam;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MADELEINE Z. BORDALLO, Acting Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act, as amended, do hereby order:

- 1. There is created the Welfare Reform Task Force consisting of a representative of the following government agencies:
 - a) Governor's Office
 - b) Department of Law
 - c) Bureau of Planning
 - d) Bureau of Budget and Management Research
 - e) Department of Labor
 - f) Agency for Human Resources Development
 - g) Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Agency
 - h) Department of Public Health and Social Services
 - i) Department of Commerce; and
- 2. The representative of the Department of Public Health and Social Services shall chair the task force; and

- 3. The Welfare Reform Task Force shall provide broad and objective assessments and recommendations for welfare reform which are appropriate for Guam. The Welfare Reform Task Force shall also review the current general assistance program rules, as well as other aspects of the program; and
- 4. The Welfare Reform Task Force shall make a report on its findings and recommendations to the Governor by no later than October 1, 1995.
- 5. The Welfare Reform Task Force shall expire on October 1, 1995.
