EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 95-28

RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE ON THE SCHOOL-TO-WORK TRANSITION PROGRAM ON GUAM.

WHEREAS, Guam has provided leadership in its education programs for elementary, secondary, post-secondary levels; for vocational education; and skill learning; and

WHEREAS, Guam has continued to facilitate innovative educational programs; and

WHEREAS, these innovative programs have included Alternative Learning Paths, Community Based Education, Cooperative Education; Vocational Education, and Skilled Learning Education; and

WHEREAS, a skilled work force is the foundation for economic development and a high standard of living; and

WHEREAS, Guam needs a comprehensive and coherent system to help its citizens acquire the knowledge, skills, and information about the labor work force necessary to make an effective transition from education to career-oriented work; and

WHEREAS, three-fourths of Guam's workers enter the work force without a degree or college education; and

WHEREAS, there is a desire and need for an educational system that facilitates transition from secondary to post-secondary education, from education to the world of work, and continued education in the work place;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T. C. GUTIERREZ, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act do order:

- 1. The Task Force on School-to-Work Transition is hereby created and is charged with the responsibility to develop an action plan to establish an island wide School-to-Work Plan. As a minimum, the plan should include:
 - a) The integration of school-to-work transition as an essential part of Guam's education and training systems;
 - b) Essential skill learning requirements and performance-based assessments for secondary students after they receive a Certificate of Mastery;
