## GOVERNMENT OF GUAM OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR AGANA, GUAM

## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 73-1

WHEREAS, we are now in the mackeral (Atulai) season, and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam have always been close to the sea,

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the net fishing art known as chenchulo (drag netting) not be lost to our people and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 72-13 placing rules and regulations in effect for the Agana Boat Basin did prohibit all forms of net fishing in the Agana Boat Basin, and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that net fishing be allowed during this fishing season, provided that no boats are endangered by net fishing practices.

NOW, THEREFORE, by authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, it is ordered as follows:

- 1. Portions of Sections 7.01 and 7.02 of the Agana Boat Basin rules regarding net fishing are hereby suspended for a period of one month effective January 8, 1973 to allow drag net fishing during this mackeral season.
- 2. During this one month period, conservation officers of the Department of Agriculture and patrolmen of the Department of Public Safety will not prevent drag net fishing, provided that boats utilizing the Boat Basin channel are not endangered, and that nets not be left unattended.
