REPEAL OF EXECUTIVE ORDER 76-12 AND 76-14

WHEREAS, on May 22, 1976, Executive Order 76-12 was signed and promulgated imposing a curfew; and

WHEREAS, on May 25, 1976, Executive Order 76-14 was signed and promulgated to amend Executive Order 76-12; and

WHEREAS, on June 3, 1976, a course of action was filed in the U.S. District Court of Guam to enjoin the Governor from enforcing the aforementioned Executive Orders 76-12 and 76-14; and

WHEREAS, on June 7, 1976, a preliminary hearing was conducted to ascertain the constitutionality and legality of said Executive Orders; and

WHEREAS, on June 8, 1976, the Honorable Cristobal C. Duenas, Judge, U. S. District Court of Guam, did order that the Governor did not have the authority to impose said curfew, and did order that the Governor and his agents be permanently enjoined for enforcing said curfew;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICARDO J. BORDALLO, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do hereby declare that Executive Order 76-14 is repealed in its entirety and that sections in Executive Order 76-12 regarding curfews is also repealed in its entirety.

This Executive Order is made retroactive to May 22, 1976.
