EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 62-3

ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR THE CUAM EMPLOYMENT SERVICE

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 44.001, Government Code of Guam, the Government of Guam accepted the provisions of the act of the United States Congress known as the Wagner-Peyser Act (48 Stat. 113, as amended, 29 U.S.C. 49 et seq.) and did therein agree to observe and comply with the requirements of said act; and

WHEREAS, Section 11(a) of the Wagner-Peyser Act requires that each participating state establish an advisory council composed of men and women representing employers and employees in equal numbers and the public;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 6 of the Organic Act of Guam and in accordance with Section 11(a) of the Wagner-Peyser Act, it is hereby ordered as follows:

- 1. The Advisory Council of the Guam Employment Service is hereby established, consisting of five (5) members, two of whom shall represent employers, two of whom shall represent employees and one shall represent the public. Members shall be appointed by and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor, one of whom shall be designated Chairman by the Governor.
- 2. The functions of the Advisory Council for the Guam Employment Service shall be as follows:
 - (a) Advise in developing or revising policies in connection with the Guam Employment Service.
 - (b) Assist in promoting wider use of Guam Employment Service by management, labor and the public.
 - (c) Assist the Guam Employment Service in developing a program for the solution of employment problems on an island-wide basis.

- (d) Assist the Guam Employment Service in developing a legislative program for improving the "Employment Service Law", encourage acceptance by the Government of Guam of such a program and cooperate with the Guam Employment Service in promoting greater understanding and acceptance of the program by the public.
- (e) Promote cooperation with other agencies and organizations concerned with employment and unemployment problems.
- (f) Promote public understanding of the Guam Employment Service and its policies and programs.
 - (g) Such other functions as may be assigned by the Governor.
- 3. The Advisory Council for the Guam Employment Service is attached to the Department of Labor and Personnel for logistic support, including the furnishing of office space and clerical assistance.
