## Leon Guerrero-Tenorio Administration Revives Guam Ethics Commission

Hagåtña, Guam - The Leon Guerrero-Tenorio Administration has announced the revival of the Guam Ethics Commission. The Commission was re-established through Executive Order 2019-06, signed by Acting Governor of Guam Joshua F. Tenorio, in coordination with Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero.

The Guam Ethics Commission is intended to hold all Government of Guam employees to the highest ethical standards. The Executive Order provides that the Guam Ethics Commission "may request and shall receive from every governmental agency cooperation and assistance in the performance of its duties." The Civil Service Commission is also assigned with providing administrative and logistical support.

The initial members of the Commission will be forwarded to the 35th Guam Legislature. They include:

- 5. Donnalyn Camacho, Certified Fraud Examiner and Board Designated Bank Secrecy Act (BSA) Officer for ANZ Guam, Inc.
- 6. Marilyn Roberto, Vice President of Enterprise Sales at Docomo Pacific

The Administration continues to review potential candidates to fill one remaining vacancy.

"Our Administration is committed to transparency and accountability in government and we are pleased to appoint these members to the Guam Ethics Commission," said Acting Governor Tenorio. "After a 23-year hiatus, we are confident the Commission will now be able to focus on higher ethical standards throughout our government through this independent and qualified body."
