Governor Accepts Speaker Muña-Barnes' Challenge to Clean our Island

Hagåtña, Guam – Challenge accepted! The *Maga'Håga* will be leading an effort to pick up trash at Adelup Beach on Saturday, April 27 from 7-9 a.m. as part of the viral #TrashTag Challenge.

Together with the Department of Parks and Recreation, Department of Public Works, Island Beautification Task Force, Guam Visitors Bureau, and Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano, we did an islandwide tour of parks and what we found was shocking. We know there is a need to focus efforts on protecting our environment and cleaning up our public parks and beaches.
