Governor Signs Executive Order No. 2023-07:

Yesterday, Governor Lou Leon Guerrero signed Executive Order No. 2023-07 relative to continuing the State of Emergency in response to Typhoon Mawar and orders such that:

- **State of Emergency continues.** The state of emergency declared in Executive Order No. 2023-02 in response to the approach of Tropical Storm Mawar (now Typhoon Mawar) remains in effect.
- **Emergency Procurement and Emergency Expenses.** The authorization in E.O. No. 2023-02 for emergency procurements, which was expanded in scope and amounts in E.O. No. 2023-05, continues in effect.
- **Authorization for Overtime.** The authorization in E.O. No. 2023-02 for payment of overtime, for exempt and non-exempt Government of Guam employees, to work in excess of forty (40) hours a week in order to mitigate and respond to the effects of Typhoon Mawar throughout Guam, which was expanded in authorized amounts in E.O. No. 2023-05, remains in effect.
- **Documentation of Expenses.** All departments and agencies are reminded to keep appropriate documentation on all emergency expenses incurred pursuant to this Executive Order for inspection by the Executive and Legislative Branches and by the Public Auditor of Guam, and in anticipation of federal disaster assistance approval by the President of the United States to be administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Public Assistance Deadline Update:

Public Assistance for all Categories (A-G and Z) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is available. Government of Guam agencies, certain private non-profit (PNP) organizations, and faith-based organizations have the opportunity to apply for funding reimbursements for the response and recovery efforts for Typhoon Mawar.

How to Apply:

Eligible subrecipients may register their organization and submit a Request for Public Assistance (RPA) through FEMA's [Grants Portal](#). Entities without existing Grants Portal access or in need of updating their access may email gro@ghs.guam.gov. All RPA submissions must be submitted via Grants Portal.

Briefings Available:

The Guam Recovery Office (GRO), with the Offices of Guam Homeland Security and Civil Defense, in collaboration with FEMA, will conduct FEMA Public Assistance Applicant Briefings for eligible subrecipients. All attendees are advised to bring their laptops or electronic devices to access Grants Portal. GRO staff will be available to assist with establishing access to Grants Portal Accounts.

Agencies unable to attend on the scheduled date or meet the due date are advised to attend the next session and/or let the GRO know.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2023-07

**RELATIVE TO CONTINUING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN
RESPONSE TO TYPHOON MAWAR**

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2023, I issued Executive Order No. 2023-02 in anticipation of the approach of Tropical Storm Mawar. On May 22, 2023, at my request, President Joseph R. Biden issued Emergency Declaration FEMA-3594-EM; and

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2023, Typhoon Mawar made landfall on Guam, with sustained winds of 140 mph and gusts up to 170 mph. Typhoon Mawar maintained its intensity as it passed through the Rota Channel between Guam and Rota, with destructive typhoon force winds continuing through May 25, 2023. On May 25, 2023, at my request, President Biden issued Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4715-DR; and

WHEREAS, on May 28, 2023, I submitted a request to President Joseph R. Biden, that all Individual Assistance ("IA") programs be designated to Guam in response to Typhoon Mawar, including the Individuals and Household Program and Other Needs Assistance, Disaster Case Management, Crisis Counseling and Assistance, Disaster Legal Services, Disaster Unemployment Assistance, Critical Needs Assistance, and the Clean and Removal Assistance, under the Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4715-DR; and

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2023, in a subsequent letter to President Biden, I requested for Public Assistance ("PA") Authorization to request aid for Debris Removal, Repair of Road and Bridges, Water Control Facilities, Buildings and Equipment, and Park, Recreational and Other categories under the Major Disaster Declaration; and

WHEREAS, our island has not seen a typhoon of this magnitude in over twenty (20) years. Though emergency response actions have been implemented consistent with hazard mitigation plans, in the time that has elapsed since the original emergency declaration in E.O. 2023-02, issued on May 21st, it has become necessary to focus our efforts in response to the specific circumstances that have emerged in the aftermath of Typhoon Mawar; and

WHEREAS, Typhoon Mawar caused substantial damage to our island's critical infrastructure, including power, water and telecommunications. The Guam Power Authority and the Guam Waterworks Authority have worked around the clock to restore water and power to our residents. As of the time of this writing, 80% of GWA water wells are online, with total production estimated at 99% of pre-typhoon production. Further, power has been restored to an estimated 78.5% of customers; and

WHEREAS, both power and water systems remain unstable as services are restored to other areas. Though, without question, restoration efforts have been undertaken in a systematic and methodical manner, and in a significantly more expedient manner than occurred in previous typhoons, it is timely and appropriate to explore further opportunities to build resiliency in these critical areas; and

WHEREAS, the storm damaged a number of homes and buildings, and in some cases, demolished entire homes. Many of our residents continue to reside in temporary shelters run by the American Red Cross. As of the time of this writing, approximately four hundred (400) of our residents reside in these shelters. Temporary shelters are not, however, a sufficient solution for our people; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Defense, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Office of the Governor of Guam, Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense, and the Mayors' Council of Guam, has launched Operation RISEUP on Guam, by which roof repair assistance is provided to residences; and

WHEREAS, it can be reasonably anticipated that the damage to homes caused by Typhoon Mawar will require long term solutions that create housing opportunities for families who lost their homes in the storm. These challenges are further exacerbated by the preexisting housing shortage on our island. In response to these challenges, I intend to leverage all avenues available under the laws of Guam to respond to the homelessness caused by Typhoon Mawar; and

WHEREAS, the storm also resulted in substantial storm debris, including extensive green waste consisting of organic vegetative matter such as leaves, fallen trees, limbs, stumps, branches, and yard waste. The Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Public Works have stood up a staging site where white goods, plastics, household hazardous waste, green waste, wood waste, and scrap metal may be disposed of; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Solid Waste Authority ("GSWA") has likewise contributed substantially to the cleanup effort, collecting household trash for the island, including for those who are not GSWA subscribers; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the efforts of these agencies, it is timely and necessary to explore long term solutions to address the disposal of debris on our island; and

WHEREAS, significant work has been done, but significantly more work remains. I thank our responding agencies, our mayors, our federal and non-profit partners, and our larger Guam community for stepping up to support those in our community most in need during this difficult time.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LOURDES A. LEON GUERRERO, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, and the laws of Guam, do order as follows:

1. **State of Emergency continues.** The state of emergency declared in Executive Order No. 2023-02 in response to the approach of Tropical Storm Mawar (now Typhoon Mawar) remains in effect.

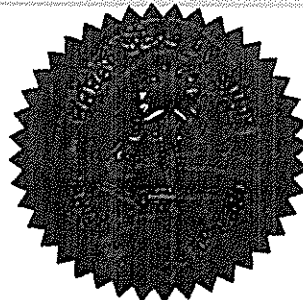

4. **Documentation of Expenses.** All departments and agencies are reminded to keep appropriate documentation on all emergency expenses incurred pursuant to this Executive Order for inspection by the Executive and Legislative Branches and by the Public Auditor of Guam, and in anticipation of federal disaster assistance approval by the President of the United States to be administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
5. **Severability.** If any provision of this Executive Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Order that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this order are severable.
6. **Prior Orders Remain in Effect.** All prior Executive Orders remain in full force and effect except to the extent they conflict with this Order.

Disaster SNAP Benefits Available for Residents that Do Not Qualify for SNAP

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced the launch of the Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP). D-SNAP gives food assistance to low-income households with food loss or damage caused by a natural disaster. D-SNAP has income and asset limitations. D-SNAP extends benefits to many households that would not ordinarily qualify but suddenly need food assistance because of a disaster.

“Today, we are proud to announce additional financial support for families affected by Typhoon Mawar, especially those who have yet to have their power restored and have been challenged with food preservation to feed their families,” said Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. “In the aftermath of Typhoon Mawar, we extend a caring hand to our community. Applying for the Disaster SNAP program is a powerful act of self-care and resilience. Let us help in your recovery,”

“We encourage families who would not have otherwise been eligible for SNAP benefits to examine the increased threshold under Disaster SNAP and check for eligibility,” added Lt. Governor Joshua Tenorio.

D-SNAP benefits are provided via an electronic debit-like card and can be used to purchase food items at authorized food retailers. Recipients already enrolled in SNAP are not eligible to receive D-SNAP assistance. Individuals must bring a valid I.D. and must apply at the following approved D-SNAP enrollment centers:

Residents in Dededo, Harmon, Tumon, and Yigo are encouraged to apply at the **Micronesian Mall** in Dededo, residents in Agana Heights, Hagatna, Mangilao, Mongmong-Toto-Maite, Ordot-Chalan Pago, Piti, and Yona are encouraged to apply at **GPO** in Tamuning, and residents in Agat, Inalahan, Talofoto and Umatac are encouraged to apply at the **Inalahan Senior Citizens Center** in Inalahan.

Household income may also be adjusted for any disaster-related expenses that the applicant experienced from the effects of Typhoon Mawar, such as damage or destruction of household. Below is a list of approved expenses:

- Home and Business Repairs and Property Protection
- Temporary Shelter and Evacuation Expenses
- Disaster Related funeral, pet boarding and medical expenses
- Replacement of necessary personal items such as clothing, appliances, tools, and educational materials
- Clean up expenses, and storage expenses
- Food Loss

Retirement accounts, disaster related payments from either governmental and/or non-governmental organizations **will not** be counted against D-SNAP applicants. If awarded, individuals will only receive a month's worth of benefits. Any self-attestation provided to DPHSS in order to apply for D-SNAP benefits **are subject to any and all audit requirements enforced by the Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) under the USDA.**

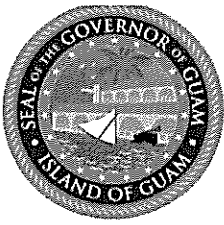

Typhoon Debris Waste Disposal Sites Update; Green Waste Disposal Sites Update

Typhoon Debris Waste Disposal Sites Update:

As a reminder, effective Wednesday, June 21, 2023 through Wednesday, July 5, 2023, the three Typhoon Mawar disaster debris disposal sites will be operational:

- Monday through Friday from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- Saturday-Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The updated hours will impact sites at the old transfer station in Dededo, the former Tiyan carnival grounds in Barrigada and Ypao Point in Tamuning. The change in hours is to allow the Department of Public Works to increase site capacity and to ensure compliance with regulatory safety standards.

During this time, Government of Guam agencies and departments will continue to have access to the disaster debris disposal sites from Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Junk tires are no longer being accepted at this time. The community is reminded to PROPERLY SECURE WASTE LOADS BEFORE traveling to any disposal site. To ensure efficient flow at each typhoon debris disposal site, the public is advised to **PRE-SORT AND SEGREGATE** waste prior to arrival at the sites. Capacities at each site vary, and some waste types may be diverted to other sites with more capacity.

Guam Environmental Protection Agency personnel and Americorps, Serve Guam Commission volunteers are on-site to inspect debris loads, and waste types not approved for disposal at these three sites will be rejected. The identification, transportation and disposal of household hazardous waste is made possible through the coordination of the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Green Waste Disposal Sites Update:

The Government of Guam's green waste transition sites are open for residential green waste disposal from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., 7 days a week. **These sites accept only green waste, vegetative waste, and yard trimmings.** All other disaster debris including, but not limited to metallic waste, white goods, bulky household waste, household hazardous waste, and household trash will be REJECTED. 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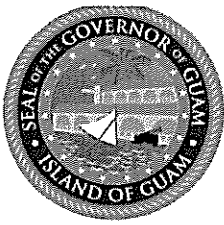

Typhoon Debris Waste Disposal Sites Update:

As a reminder, effective Wednesday, June 21, 2023 through Wednesday, July 5, 2023, the three Typhoon Mawar disaster debris disposal sites will be operational:

- Monday through Friday from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- Saturday-Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The updated hours will impact sites at the old transfer station in Dededo, the former Tiyan carnival grounds in Barrigada and Ypao Point in Tamuning. The change in hours is to allow the Department of Public Works to increase site capacity and to ensure compliance with regulatory safety standards.

During this time, Government of Guam agencies and departments will continue to have access to the disaster debris disposal sites from Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Junk tires are no longer being accepted at this time. The community is reminded to PROPERLY SECURE WASTE LOADS BEFORE traveling to any disposal site. To ensure efficient flow at each typhoon debris disposal site, the public is advised to **PRE-SORT AND SEGREGATE** waste prior to arrival at the sites. Capacities at each site vary, and some waste types may be diverted to other sites with more capacity.

The identification, transportation and disposal of household hazardous waste is made possible through the coordination of the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Green Waste Disposal Sites Update:

The Government of Guam's green waste transition sites are open for residential green waste disposal from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., 7 days a week. **These sites accept only green waste, vegetative waste, and yard trimmings.** All other disaster debris including, but not limited to metallic waste, white goods, bulky household waste,

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) will launch the Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) which has income and asset limitations. D-SNAP extends benefits to many households that would not ordinarily qualify but suddenly need food assistance because of a disaster. Households not enrolled in SNAP are not eligible to receive D-SNAP assistance.

D-SNAP Frequently Asked Questions:

- Which D-SNAP Enrollment Center should I visit? Is it based on what village I am from?
 - It is not based on what village you are from. Residents are encouraged to visit a D-SNAP Enrollment Center that is convenient for them, at a distance of no more than 10 miles.
- What do I need to bring to the D-SNAP Enrollment Center?
 - Bring a valid I.D. You will be asked to sign a self attestation form to determine the net income.
- What is the timeframe of Net Income?

- Is this limited to US Citizens?

 - Yes, you both may apply as a head of household, however you can't both claim the same losses. Example: if the combined households lost \$30,000, each household can claim \$15,000 in losses.

FEMA's Personal Property Assistance is limited to helping with basic needs after Typhoon Mawar; it will not recover all property losses, and it is not a substitute for insurance coverage. However, FEMA's Personal Property Assistance may repair or replace disaster-damaged property if the eligibility requirements are met, and the items fall within any of these categories:

- **Appliances:** includes common household appliances, such as a refrigerator, washing machine, etc.
- **Clothing:** essential clothing needed due to overall loss, damage, or contamination
- **Home furnishings:** basic furnishings found in a bedroom, kitchen, bathroom and living room
- **Tools required for work and school:** equipment required for work, or necessary school items for you and your family members
- **Accessible items:** FEMA also provides assistance for damaged personal property required for qualified applicants with disabilities

The following conditions must be met to receive Personal Property Assistance:

- To be eligible, these items must have been owned before the typhoon
- The item was owned and being used by occupants of the household
- FEMA does not provide assistance for furnishings and/or appliances provided by a landlord
- Items used by guests and relatives who were not members of the pre-disaster household are also not eligible for assistance

Additionally, FEMA may not repair or replace a typhoon-damaged item if you own a similar item that works. 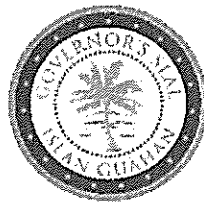

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2023-06

**RELATIVE TO DECLARING A SECOND STATE OF EMERGENCY DUE
TO THE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY SHORTAGE CAUSED BY TYPHOON
MAWAR**

WHEREAS, on June 3, 2023, I issued Executive Order No. 2023-04, declaring a state of emergency due to the public water supply shortage caused by Typhoon Mawar; and

WHEREAS, as noted in E.O. 2023-04, Typhoon Mawar caused substantial damage to our island's critical infrastructure, including power and water. As of the time of this writing, water restoration efforts continue around the island, and the restoration of water in higher lying areas and areas relying on "gravity feeds" continues to hinge on increasing and stabilizing reservoir levels; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Waterworks Authority ("GWA") has requested that residents with water service continue to conserve and limit the use of their water to cleaning, bathing and cooking in order to allow replenishment and stabilization of our reservoirs; and

WHEREAS, 9 GCA Section 55.60 provides that upon a declaration by the Governor of a state of emergency as the result of a disaster that threatens the public water supply, it shall be a petty misdemeanor for any person to use water supplied by GWA for any unauthorized purpose not pertaining to public, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Section 55.60 provides further that a state of emergency under the section shall be for a period of no more than fifteen (15) days, but that the Governor may proclaim successive states of emergency if she deems it to be in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, I have communicated with GWA regarding the current status of the restoration progress to ascertain whether an additional emergency declaration is necessary to ensure continued delivery of water to our community. GWA has advised me that while it is making incremental gains in tank levels, inconsistent production in some areas has slowed the recovery of levels. GWA further states that while it anticipates improvement in the number of customers with water service, water pressure remains insufficient. Accordingly, GWA intends to maintain its Water Conservation Advisory for an additional one (1) week period, at which time it will reassess; and

WHEREAS, in light of the current report from GWA, I find that it is in the public interest that I declare a second state of emergency to continue the activation of Section 55.60, eliminate or reduce unauthorized use of water, allow our reservoirs to recover, and support the delivery of water to the members of our community who urgently need it.


NOW THEREFORE, I, LOURDES A. LEON GUERRERO, I Maga'hågan Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam as amended, do hereby order:





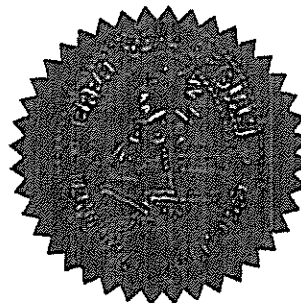
1. **DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY.** A second state of emergency is hereby declared for the island of Guam due to the public water supply shortage as a result of Typhoon Mawar.
 - a. Pursuant to 9 G.C.A. Section 55.60, individuals should only use water supplied by GWA for authorized uses pertaining to public health, safety and welfare. Specific unauthorized uses provided in Section 55.60 include washing motor vehicles, windows, streets, sidewalks and buildings.
 - b. This order shall be effective at midnight on June 19, 2023 and shall continue in effect for a period of fifteen (15) days. It shall expire on July 4, 2023, unless otherwise amended or rescinded by further executive order.
2. **SEVERABILITY.** If any provision of this Executive Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Order that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this order are severable.
3. **PRIOR ORDERS REMAIN IN EFFECT.** All prior Executive Orders remain in full force and effect except to the extent they conflict with this Order.

The temporary metal roof is **intended** to:

- Cover homes expeditiously to help homeowners move back into their residence
- Replace missing metal roofs with a metal sheeting FEMA has in stock
- Replace damaged rafters and purlins with wood materials FEMA has in stock
- Stop the majority of rain from entering the home

The temporary roof metal is **not**:

- Guaranteed to stop all water from entering the home
- A custom designed roof that ensures a watertight solution
- Designed to be a permanent solution
- Guaranteed to match existing roof materials

Guam residents who have damaged metal roofs can enroll for the program through their Mayor's office. There are three steps to sign up:

1. Guam resident contacts their Mayor's office to apply.
2. Resident's roof damage is assessed for eligibility.
3. If eligible, a temporary metal roof is installed.

The timeline for how fast temporary roofs can be installed will be largely based on the number of requests and size of the area impacted.

Guam residents do not need to register with FEMA to qualify for this program and participation will not affect other forms of federal disaster assistance, such as those pro

Emergency roof repair assistance is limited to pre-disaster owner-occupied residences. Repairs to commercial properties, including rental units are ineligible.

Additional Eligibility Criteria:

- Dwellings must have disaster-caused roof damage that impacts habitability.

RISEUP Temporary Roof Project:

The U.S. Department of Defense, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in coordination with the Office of the Governor, Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Mayor's Council of Guam, continue the Roofing Installation Support Emergency Utilization Program (RISEUP) to help temporarily repair metal roofs damaged by Typhoon Mawar.

What it Is and What it Is Not:

RISEUP is intended to be a temporary roof repair solution for homeowners with damaged metal roofs. The program utilizes general metal roofing materials to quickly install a roof. The goal is to allow for the resident to reside in their homes while reducing additional weather-related impacts to the house.

The temporary metal roof **is intended to:**

- Cover homes expeditiously to help homeowners move back into their residence
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2. Resident's roof damage is assessed for eligibility.
3. If eligible, a temporary metal roof is installed.

The timeline for how fast temporary roofs can be installed will be largely based on the number of requests and size of the area impacted.

Guam residents do not need to register with FEMA to qualify for this program and participation will not affect other forms of federal disaster assistance, such as those provided by FEMA.

Emergency roof repair assistance is limited to pre-disaster owner-occupied residences. Repairs to commercial properties, including rental units are ineligible.

Additional Eligibility Criteria:

- Dwellings must have disaster-caused roof damage that impacts habitability.

- Dwellings must be otherwise structurally sound. Only dwellings that can be safely occupied after the roof repairs have been completed are eligible. Dwellings that are affected by disaster-caused utility outages are not disqualified based on utility outages alone.
- Approximately 50% of roof substructure (rafters/trusses) must remain, as determined by USACE.
- The damaged roof must cover indoor living space completely enclosed by walls. Living space includes facilities for cooking, eating, sleeping and sanitation. Outdoor kitchens with a damaged roof covering will qualify to the extent that it covers the dwelling's only means of cooking and storing food. Garages, carports, porches, etc. do not qualify.
- Repairs will only be performed on dwellings with pre-disaster metal roofs. Roofs composed of materials such as concrete, slate, asbestos or clay tile, or other material are not covered under this program.
- Homes unable to be assessed are not eligible. Accessibility is the responsibility of the resident and GovGuam.

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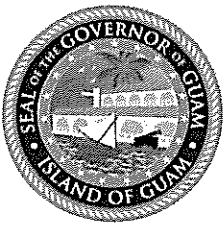

GWA Update; Capacity Advisory for Green Waste Sites: Contractors License Board Extends Renewal Deadline

GWA Update:

The Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) has lifted its precautionary boil-water notice in all areas with stable water service, meaning areas with adequate pressure, chlorine residual levels in the water, and water sampling and analysis which indicate the water in GWA's distribution system is clear of any contaminants.

As of 2 p.m., June 13, 2023 GWA lifted its Precautionary Boil Water Notice completely for the Southern Water System, which includes all areas served by the Ugum Surfi Treatment Plant from Ipan Talofoto to Umatac.

For the Northern and Central Water Systems, GWA is adjusting its Precautionary Boil Water Notice which will now be applicable only to the village of Mangilao, and isolated areas in Barrigada, Ordot-Chalan Pago, Dededo, and Yigo.

Disaster Debris Disposal Sites Operational 9 A.M. - 6 P.M.:

The three typhoon debris disposal sites located at the old transfer station in Dededo, the former Tiyan carnival grounds in Barrigada, and Ypao Point in Tamuning are open from 9 a.m. - 6 p.m., seven days a week.

- Tires are no longer accepted at debris disposal sites
- Green waste is no longer being accepted at the old transfer station in Dededo due to capacity
- High volumes of waste are being disposed at the three sites and delays are expected when DPW crews are on site to increase capacities for household waste
- Scavenging through waste is strictly prohibited

Capacity Advisory for Green Waste Sites:

As of 3 p.m. today, the Agana Heights, Astumbo, Dededo, Mangilao, and Yigo green waste transition sites are at 100% capacity and are no longer accepting green waste at this time.

The Hagatna, MTM, and Talofoto Green Waste Sites are at 90% capacity. The Ordot, Sinajana, and Asan Green Waste sites are at 80% capacity. Residents with green waste are urged to visit the disaster debris disposal sites at the former Tiyan carnival grounds in Barrigada or Ypao Point in Tamuning.

Contractors License Board Extends Renewal Deadline:

The Contractors License Board has extended this year's renewal deadline from June 30, 2023 to August 31, 2023. A Contractors License is required for those performing construction work as defined in 21 GCA Real Property CH 70 Contractors (Public Law 30-11).

§ 70100 (b) Contractor means any person who undertakes to construct, alter, repair, add to, subtract from, improve, move, wreck or demolish any building, highway, road, excavation or other structure, project development or improvement or do any part thereof, including the erection of scaffolding or other structure of works in connection therewith for another person for a fee.

§ 70108 (a) No person within the purview of this Chapter shall act, or assume to act, or advertise, as a general engineering contractor, a general building contractor or a specialty contractor without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the Contractors License Board (CLB).

§ 70121 - Violation, Penalty. Any person who violates or omits to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined an amount no less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) but not to exceed fifty percent (50%) of the value of the project.

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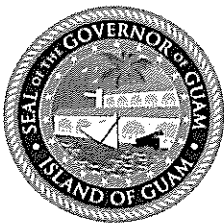

Avoid Sharing Unofficial Information:

The Joint Information Center is aware of an unofficial circulating message purporting that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is informing the community to hire private contractors to conduct assessments. That circulating message and guidance is false.

The community is reminded to avoid sharing unofficial information and messages further, to avoid confusion.

To clarify, FEMA always advises disaster survivors to **first contact their insurance company** and go through their established process for submitting a claim for damages. Then survivors should apply for federal disaster assistance at **disasterassistance.gov**, by using the **FEMA mobile app**, by calling **800-621-3362** (The Helpline is available 24 hours a day/ 7 days a week at no cost for Guam residents) or by stopping by a Disaster Recovery Center located at **Guam Community College, Dededo Sports Complex, C.L. Taitano Elementary School and Inalahan Community Center** (open seven days a week 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.).

Survivors may be eligible to receive assistance for **uninsured and underinsured damage** and losses resulting from Typhoon Mawar. If they have homeowners, renters or flood insurance, they should **file a claim as soon as possible** because FEMA cannot duplicate benefits for losses covered by insurance. If their policy does not cover all their disaster expenses, they may be eligible for federal assistance.

Federal assistance may include financial help with **temporary lodging and home repairs, as well as other disaster-related expenses**.

GWA Update:

The Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) provides the Water System Status update as of 9 a.m.:

Northern:

- GWA northern water system is operating normally.
- 91 operable wells are online (76% of total wells).
- There are currently 47 wells on island power and 44 operating on gensets.
- GWA continues to operate all available wells to increase reservoir levels throughout the northern system and send more water to the Central System.

Central:

- Santa Rita and Agat have been restored.
- Service on Cross-island road area restored up to the Sumay area of Santa Rita.
- Talo'fo'fo main village has been restored.
- Piti, including the higher area of Nimitz Hill, Asan, and Hagatna, are fully restored.
- Until levels in Barrigada, Chaot, and Mangilao reservoir levels build, higher areas in Mangilao, Ordot, Chalan Pago will continue to experience intermittent service disruption during peak demand times.

Southern:

- GWA's southern water system continues to operate at reduced capacity at the Ugum Surface Water Treatment Plant.
- Water services are restored from Ipan to Umatac.

Ten (10) - 6,000 gallon Flexible Potable Water Tanks (FPWT):**North**

- Dededo Mayor's Office, Dededo
- Mount Santa Rosa (near observatory), Yigo
- Astumbo Community Center, Dededo
- Yigo Gym, Yigo
- Yigo, Gill-Breeze Subdivision

Central

- St. Teresita Church, Mangilao
- Adacao Elementary School
- Shop 4 Less – stationed at the rear of the building on S. Biang St side, Maite

South

- Santa Rita/Apra Hts - Sinifa
- Agat, Santa Ana

The water tanks listed above are accessible 24 hours a day/7 days a week at this time. Once the tanks are depleted, they will be refilled and returned to service at locations still without water.

A precautionary boil water notice remains in place. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Residents island-wide, who have water service, are asked to limit use for cleaning, bathing, and cooking in order to conserve water to allow reservoir levels to increase.

As a reminder, the community is urged for the following:

- The DYA Cottage Homes site on Vicente Castro Street in Talofofo is only open for GREEN WASTE.
- To ensure efficient flow at each typhoon debris disposal site, residents must **PRE-SORT AND SEGREGATE** waste prior to arrival at the typhoon debris disposal sites.
- Scavengers and scavenger hunting in the disposal site are strictly prohibited

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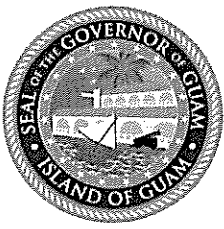



Disaster Assistance Accessible, Let FEMA Know Your Needs; Disaster Debris Site Advisory

The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) mission is helping people before, during and after disasters in ways that maximize the inclusion of, and accessibility for, people with disabilities.

FEMA provides federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial governments, the public sector and non-profit organizations with the tools, training, resources, and strategies necessary to help ensure that people with disabilities can participate in, and benefit from, programs and services during all phases of emergency management.

Let FEMA Know Your Needs:

Be sure to let FEMA know if you have an accessibility need. During the application process, applicants for FEMA disaster assistance have equal access to FEMA programs and services. Applicants with disabilities who need accommodation should inform FEMA.

A disaster can take away important items that enable people with disabilities to live independently or to communicate. These include a wheelchair, scooter, walker, CPAP machine, hearing aids, eyeglasses, screen reader or other assistive medical device. Let FEMA know if you have an accessibility need.

Applicants who go to a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) will be able to meet with specialists who can help them apply for disaster assistance and provide other information. FEMA specialists use assistive technology to serve those who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing. Specialists can connect you with an American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter through Video Remote Interpreting (VRI) to help complete your disaster assistance application or schedule an appointment for an in-person ASL interpreter.

FEMA is also distributing written information in multiple languages so everyone affected by Typhoon Mawar knows of the assistance that is available to them. Additionally, translation services for Chuukese, Pohnpeian, Kosraean, and Yapese are being provided by the Micronesian Resource Center One-Stop Shop at the Dededo Sports Complex Disaster Recovery Center from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. every day. Typhoon survivors who speak other languages can also call the FEMA Helpline at **800-621-3362**. There are multilingual operators available, simply press 2 for Spanish and 3 for other languages.

Typhoon Mawar Disaster Debris Site Advisory – Dededo and Tiyan Experiencing HIGH VOLUME:

Typhoon Mawar disaster debris disposal sites at the former Tiyan carnival grounds in Barrigada and the former transfer station in Dededo are experiencing a high volume of disposal activity. Residents are urged to visit the disaster debris disposal site located at Ypao Point in Tamuning. At this time, Ypao Point in Tamuning is not experiencing high volume. High volumes of disposal at Tiyan and Dededo sites vary and will impact capacities to accept green waste and household trash.

As a reminder, residents are urged to take note of the following:

- Beginning Monday, June 12, 2023, the following typhoon debris disposal sites effective hours of operation will be **9 a.m. - 6 p.m., seven days a week:**
 - Dededo Transfer Station
 - Ypao Point, Tamuning
 - Former Tiyan Carnival Grounds in Barrigada
- The DYA Cottage Homes site on Vicente Castro Street in Talofofo is only open for **GREEN WASTE**.
- To ensure efficient flow at each typhoon debris disposal site, residents must **PRE-SORT AND SEGREGATE** waste prior to arrival at the typhoon debris disposal sites.

If any of the typhoon debris disposal sites lack the capacity to accept household trash, residents will be advised to visit the Guam Solid Waste Authority's (GSWA) residential transfer stations. Residents will incur a fee for household trash disposal at GSWA's transfer stations beginning June 12, 2023.

The typhoon disaster debris sites will accept the following waste types:

- Metallic waste (i.e. ferrous, non-ferrous metals, cans, misc. loose metals and tin)
- Construction debris (i.e. building materials, drywall, lumber, carpet, furniture, plumbing)
- Household hazardous waste (i.e. Oil, batteries, pesticides, paint, cleaning supplies,
- Green waste (i.e. vegetative debris, trees, grass clippings, branches, logs, leaves)
- Damaged home furniture (i.e. carpet, beds, sofa, tables)
- Damaged electronic and appliances (i.e. televisions, computers, refrigerators, washers, dryers, stoves)
- Household trash

Understanding Your FEMA Letter

Residents of Guam who applied for assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will receive a letter in the mail or via email. The letter will explain your application status and how to respond.

It is important to read the letter carefully because it will include the amount of assistance FEMA may provide and information on the appropriate use of disaster assistance funds. Applicants may need to submit additional information or supporting documentation for FEMA to continue to process an application for financial assistance. Examples of missing documentation may include:

- Proof of insurance coverage
- Settlement of insurance claims or denial letter from insurance provider
- Proof of identity
- Proof of occupancy
- Proof of ownership
- Proof that the damaged property was the applicant's primary residence at the time of the disaster

If you have questions about your letter, call the disaster assistance helpline at 800-621-3362 or visit any of the FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers in Guam to find out what information FEMA needs to continue processing your registration for assistance.

FEMA assistance is not the same as insurance and only provides funds for basic work to make a home habitable, including items such as toilets, a roof, critical utilities, windows, and doors. FEMA cannot duplicate assistance provided by another source, such as insurance settlements. However, those who are underinsured may receive further assistance for unmet needs after insurance claims have been settled by submitting their insurance settlement or denial documents to FEMA. FEMA does not aid with insurance deductibles.

Appealing FEMA's Decision:

Applicants who disagree with FEMA's decision, or the amount of assistance, may submit an appeal letter and documents supporting their claim, such as a contractor's estimate for home repairs. Appeal letters must be submitted within 60 days of the date on their eligibility notification letter.

Appeals must be in writing. In a signed and dated letter, explain the reason(s) for the appeal. It should also include:

- Applicant's full name
- Disaster number (DR-4715-GU)
- Address of the pre-disaster primary residence
- Applicant's current phone number and address
- The FEMA application number on all documents

If someone other than an applicant or co-applicant writes the appeal letter, the applicant must also submit a signed statement giving that person authority to represent the applicant.

Appeal letters and supporting documents may be submitted to FEMA by fax or mail or via a FEMA online account. To set up an online account, visit DisasterAssistance.gov, click on "Apply Online" and follow the directions.

FEMA Public Assistance Available, Applicants Encouraged to Apply

President Biden approved Governor Lou Leon Guerrero's request for Public Assistance for all Categories (A-G and Z) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which provides government of Guam agencies and certain private non-profit (PNP) organizations, the opportunity to apply for funding reimbursements for the response and recovery efforts for Typhoon Mawar.

"Days leading to Typhoon Mawar's landfall, we ensured all the steps were taken to maximize the federal support available for recovery. To date, over 19,000 Guam residents have applied for FEMA Individual Assistance with \$12.4 million distributed to individuals who suffered damages," said Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. "Now, with Public Assistance available, we work towards restoring our community as a whole. This includes federal funding reimbursement for government agencies, non-profits, and our faith based organizations who suffered damages."

"We have a unique opportunity to harden our infrastructure and make critical improvements to promote our resilience," said Lt. Governor Josh Tenorio. "With Public Assistance now available, our government can apply for financial support for debris removal, protective measures, repair of public buildings and equipment, and public utilities. We encourage government agencies and organizations affected by Typhoon Mawar to submit a request for Public Assistance and learn more today."

Eligible subrecipients may register their organization and submit a Request for Public Assistance (RPA) through FEMA's Grants Portal. Entities without existing Grants Portal access or in need of updating their access may email gro@ghs.guam.gov. All RPA submissions must be submitted via Grants Portal.

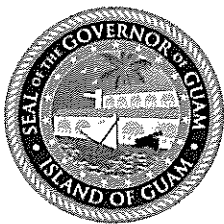
